

# MCCLLOUD SOUTH

A treasure trove of recreation, eateries, lodging, and the scenic outdoors awaits south of Highway 89 at the Central McCloud exit. Tucked away from Main Street, McCloud's South Side boasts unbeatable views of Mt. Shasta, limitless summer recreation opportunities, souvenirs and local crafts, phenomenal foods, and lodging fit for the adventurer in you. Next time you visit McCloud, don't miss your chance to explore this unique and important piece of Historic McCloud.

## LAKE MCCLLOUD

Just 10 miles south of town on Squaw Valley Road, Lake McCloud (in background), also known as the McCloud Reservoir, offers the perfect getaway on a hot summer day. With fewer boats and people than other surrounding lakes, Lake McCloud provides a quiet, relaxed, and secluded environment for the watersport enthusiast. A public boat ramp offers access to anglers, boaters, kayakers, skiers, or anyone looking to cool off in the water. Where the road forks just before the boat ramp, keep right to enjoy some of the Lake McCloud favorite swimming locales, such as Red Banks or the Old Boat Dock. Journey even further to take in the McCloud Dam, where the McCloud River continues its path down to Shasta Lake. Kayakers and some brave boaters may trek their way up the reservoir to where Mud Creek flows into the Lake and the waters turn to a silty blue. Just a little further up, you may even catch a glimpse of the infamous Hearst Castle. Fishermen and fisherwomen alike can try their hand at luring the beautiful Rainbow, Brown, and German trouts into their grasps.



## MCCLLOUD GOLF CLUB

Established in 1923, and like many of the buildings in town, McCloud Golf Club was built by the McCloud River Lumber Company using teams of horses and highwheelers. In 1935, the course opened to town residents and a few years later, to surrounding towns. Today, the McCloud Golf Course has been extensively upgraded and includes a pro shop (serving lunch and beverages), a driving range, putting green, and incredible views of Mt. ## SQUAW CREEK TRAIL

Turn right off of Squaw Valley Road just passed Friday's RV Retreat, and take the scenic drive to the Cabin Creek Trailhead of Squaw Creek Trail. Part of the PCT, this trail takes adventurers along Squaw Creek and into the wilderness for an incredible experience of McCloud's vast fauna and flora. This is a long hike, at 8.7 miles round trip. Hikers should take precautions to avoid injury (poison oak is prevalent) or disorientation.
